Combinations of HANDGUN and PCC (Guidelines)

## PCC is NOT another Division of Handgun, but an entirely SEPARATE DISCIPLINE.

Make sure to read the IPSC PCC Rulebook! Certain Rules are different from Handgun.

1 - ONE DAY ONLY MATCH / IDENTICAL STAGES - combination of Handgun and PCC (using the same stages for handgun and PCC) - the organizers must specify which Discipline will be recognized.

The one day combined match can only be sanctioned either as a Handgun or PCC, medals and the feature of posting results at the IPSC website will only be awarded, if the match was registered as either Handgun **or** PCC, not both.

- 2 ONE DAY MATCH / DIFFERENT STAGES for Handgun and PCC, and ideally having different competitors, will be sanctioned as TWO Level III matches. If time and number of slots permit, a competitor could shoot BOTH matches for score and recognition.
- 3 TWO DAY MATCHES using the same stages can be sanctioned individually, one as Handgun and another as PCC, as long as Handgun is shot on Day 1 and PCC on Day 2 regardless of the number of competitors in the second day of PCC.

For sanctioning purposes, you always need to submit full match packages for BOTH versions separately. **You may not combine the two disciplines in one document!** Remember, rules and item designations are different. Read and compare both Rulebooks, especially Rules 3.2.1 and 8.8.2 ff for PCC. Use the correct terminology and required information.

In a mixed match environment of Handgun and PCC, PCC competitors and Handgun competitors must always shoot in separate squads for safety reasons, Rule differences (e.g. no strong hand/weak hand in PCC), and consistent flow within the squad.
